Nurse Penny, School Nurse



Summer Safety Tips



Let's all work to make summer safe for kids!

Summer is a great time for kids to enjoy different indoor and outdoor activities. Whether you have young children or teens, learn ways to keep your kids safe and healthy while they enjoy the summer fun.

Water safety-Teach kids to swim, always supervise children while swimming, learn CPR, install fences around pools; Always wear a life jacket while boating.

Sun safety-Never leave children or pets in a hot car, dress children in loose, light-weight clothing, schedule outdoor activities for morning or late afternoon, use sunscreen of at least 15 SPF and be diligent to reapply frequently.

Prevent bites and diseases-Always use an effective repellent, check for ticks; make your yard a 'tick-safe zone' (cdc.gov/ticks/avoid/in_the_yard.html).

Prevent injuries-Supervise children at all times, watch high risk areas for fall such as stairs and climbing equipment, have children wear bright colored clothing, be sure to have head injuries checked and if needed follow the concussion protocol.

You do not want to miss out on any of the fun during our Sunsational Summer Camp and we hope to see you this summer!




Second Grade STEM Learning


Scholastic Book Fair Is A Crowd Pleaser

May is Overnight Month at McGinnis Woods

School overnights are an exceptional supplement to the school curriculum and learning which takes place in school each day. Overnight trips provide students with an amazing opportunity to learn outside of the classroom and often times, state. The trips start in 1st grade and continue through 8th grade



1st grade students and their parents will meet at Zoo Atlanta on the evening of May 7. They will participate in the Night Crawlers program which features behind the scenes experiences, theme activities, and up close animal encounters and many other unique adventures.

2nd graders and their parents will meet at DeSoto Caverns in Childerburg, Alabama for a fun day of activities including gem panning, rock climbing and water balloon challenges. The day ends with a family cookout, cavern tour and a once in a lifetime opportunity to spend the night inside the cave.



3rd grade students and parents will meet at the Tennessee Aquarium. The fast-paced Sleep in the Deep adventure is a tour of both the River and Ocean Journey. Students will go where the aquarists go and learn about being a part of the Aquarium team. They will meet with some of the critters up close and experience the Aquarium after the lights go down. They will sleep alongside the largest exhibits and the magnificent creatures. Students will be attending the Chattanooga Zoo this year also.

4th grade is the first year students venture off without their parents on the overnight. Students will be enjoying Nature's Classroom atop Lookout Mountain in Mentone, Alabama. They take survival classes and have fun, outdoor adventures! Small groups hike, dine, and participate in team-building activities together. After dark, opportunities for learning abound while participating in a Night Hike or the Underground Railroad simulation. Weather permitting, every evening at Nature's Classroom finishes with Reflection and a snack around the campfire.



5th – 8th grade students will go to Space Camp in Huntsville, Alabama this year. They will work as a team confronting NASA mission scenarios that require dynamic STEM, problem solving and critical thinking skills. Students will be immersed in astronaut training on various simulators and games, do teambuilding and leadership activities, construct rockets, learn the history of the space program and complete an engineering workshop.

Each of the overnight trips provide hands-on, meaningful learning, as well as memories that will last a lifetime. These trips are a great way to cap off the year!
