Track Team Finishes the Season Strong!

Our Track & Field teams over came many obstacles to have a fine ending to the season at the MAAC Track & Field Championships April 11 and 13. Many strong performances were made and many records broken.

Leading the way for the Girl's Team's 6th place finish was Tomisin Odetoyinbo. "Tee" was the meets overall high scorer with 35 points. She won three events (200, 400, Triple Jump), then also anchored both relays to high places.

She was backed up by Adrienne Lee with her places in the High Jump, Pole Vault, and 800. She was also on both relays. Courtney Stuart had a

fine two days breaking the school records in the 1600 and 3200, placing in both.

8th Grader Lindsey Campbell had a great two days with PR's in the 3200 and Shot Put. Emmalyn Cushman ran hard to some good marks in the 800 and 1600.

The Boys Team finished in 8th place. Top scorer was Sam Zoldock in both the Triple Jump and Pole Vault. Teammates Brad Dull, Chris Lee, and Jared Smith, also contributed to the team's improved score. The boys set four new school records in the meet.

"Specials" Program: Featuring Nurse Penny and Health Education

Penny Crews is the school nurse for the McGinnis Woods Preschool and Elementary School. She is a registered nurse and received her bachelor's degree in Nursing from Valdosta State University in Valdosta, Georgia. She has worked in hospitals as well the home health industry, and has been at McGinnis Woods for ten years. She takes ongoing pediatric and school nurse related medical education courses to keep abreast of the latest medical developments.

Nurse Penny enjoys her position at McGinnis Woods and really likes working with children. Teaching health at McGinnis Woods has made

working with children. Teaching health at McGinnis Woods has made her more conscience of her own health and health related issues. Nurse Penny feels that Health Education is a very popular subject among students. She loves hearing what the students share with their parents about certain class topics (even though it is not always exactly what was taught.) The students learn about so many things from the health curriculum including nutrition; safety; body organs and systems; drugs; fitness; emotions; and constantly about illness and GERMS. Approximately one month is devoted to each topic, and a variety of teaching materials are utilized.

Nurse Penny teaches the students weekly in PreK-4th and every other month in grades 5th-8th. In the upper grades, health class alternates with counseling. One of her favorite learning tools is to give the students a memory phrase every week that summarizes the topic. The students repeat the phrase several times during the class, and this really seems to help the students retain what they learned. There are a few "health traditions" that the students LOVE to participate in each year including "Organ Annie," the green jar experiment on germs, Glo-germ, and of course smoothies during the last week of school. Nurse Penny feels strongly that the McGinnis Woods staff, students and parents are the BEST!

Nurse Penny is married to Scott and lives in Alpharetta with their two sons, Addison and Andrew. She enjoys cooking, especially baking, as well as gardening, completing puzzles and reading. She loves dogs and has two precious cocker spaniels named Cami and Spencer.
