A Message From Ms. Mary

On Thursday, we had a day long, five year campus review by the Georgia Accrediting Commission (GAC). The rigorous accreditation process is important in the life of



every school and helps to provide and maintain important standards of that detail the qualities of effective schools. She then moved to the child across the table who was equally engrossed and had many purple items glued to her collage and said, "Tell me about what you are learning? The little girl smiled largely and said, "The same thing as him!"

One of the things that I find special about working with students is the many ways they make me smile. Needless to say, we were all tickled and somewhat puzzled by their responses. What the consultant didn't know is that I had overheard the teachers preparing the children earlier in the day that the class would have visitors and that they should do what they always do, work hard, be themselves, and change "nothing". Our literal thinkers had taken the instructions to heart....Their responses of, "Just doing nothing" was their innocent interpretation of what their teachers had encouraged them to do. Words are powerful tools and the students were determined to make their teachers proud and do what they had been instructed to!

We once again received GAC's highest accreditation level, *Accredited with Quality*. This recognition of our school's efforts should affirm, encourage and re-energize us all to continue to do what is best for our students and to fulfill our mission each day.
