For individuals with restricted diets and allergies, they are grateful for grocery store gift cards in small denominations (\$10 – \$25). All food pantries are struggling this year. However, because they are requesting that the items be delivered during the first full week in December, we will be putting up the trees a bit early on November 16. The trees will be decorated with ornaments requesting gifts for families in need. Each year the children excitedly participate. 


Preschool Corner (Infants through Pre-K3/4)

Yanira Cedillo is the Spanish Teacher for Pre-K—8th grade students at McGinnis Woods Country Day School. She also helps with the after school program, where you often see her lending a hand wherever she is needed.

Ms. Yanira is originally from the Island of Puerto Rico. In 2002, she received her BA in Education from the Interamerican University of Puerto Rico. After completing her Teaching Certification in 2003, she began work as a preschool teacher for the Head Start Programs there. She then became interested in the area of special education and decided to enhance her qualifications by specializing in this area. She returned to school and acquired her qualifications to work with children with special needs. She worked in that capacity for two years in the public schools of Puerto Rico.
