# What is new in the middle grades at McGinnis Woods this year?



The students in the fifth through eighth grade are considered "middle grades" students at McGinnis Woods Country Day School. This school year is in full swing now with the completion of their first term. The school is excited to announce some motivating new additions to the curriculum for our oldest students. Language Arts class is using the ideal new Pearson curriculum including new books and many interactive technology components. Science class is even more electrifying with the addition of weekly student driven lab presentations every Friday. Chorus class is also really in tune with creating their new musical artist personas.

The Language Arts Pearson curriculum includes many interactive technology components. This online aspect allows student to access the literature and response sections at home. Students enjoy watching the videos featuring authors and their stories. The vocabulary videos and games are created to help students grasp the terminology and accomplish the Common Core Standards.

Science lab on Fridays help students explore their curiosity in science by choosing their own lab experiments and presenting their findings to the class. This allows all students hands-on investigation opportunities with an emphasis on science that tests the trials of the scientific method.

Chorus students have been working hard to describe themselves in an interview with a musical artist façade. Students have also been writing their own songs based on their artist's genre and they will soon perform in a music video for the class.

Middle school students have remarkable talents and promising potential. The impressive new opportunities at McGinnis Woods are just a few ways the school provides superior academics through hands-on approaches, which foster self-confidence and self-esteem that inspire a lifelong love of learning.

On Thursday, October 10th McGinnis Woods students and teachers joined together to raise funds for the organization CURE and cancer research. CURE dedicates nearly \$2.5 million annually to specific research projects aimed at solving cancers which affect children. This opportunity provided our school community an avenue to honor all of the brave children battling pediatric cancer.

Students, teachers and staff each contributed a donation of \$5 and wore their favorite jeans to school. McGinnis Woods raised a total of \$796.25. #### Robotics

Robotics is underway at McGinnis Woods Country Day School. *Lego Mindstorms Robotics* is being offered as an after-school club. Robotics students design, build and program robots using Lego parts and a special programmable "Robot Brain" or "Brick". They write programs using software designed especially for *Lego Mindstorms Robots* to get the robots to accomplish certain tasks as they move through their environment. We also will be fielding a team of 10 robotics engineers to compete in the annual First Lego League robotics competition. The theme of the competition for this year is "Nature's Fury" – helping people cope with natural disasters. We have a field set with various missions the robots must accomplish to score points. The competition is held in early December at a several school lo-



cations around the Metro Atlanta Area. We are usually placed in the Walton High Regional tournament which will take place on December 7 this year.

#### Project Showcase, More Than Just a Project

It is time for Project Showcase for the first through eighth grade students! Students have already selected their topics, and the final presentations are due on October 28th. Why do we do Project Showcase at McGinnis Woods?

Project Showcase is a great way for students to delve in depth on a topic of interest. Also, Project Showcase allows students to use different types of skills. The projects are hands-on and allow for students to showcase their artistic and creative talents. The presentation portion of Project Showcase is a great way for students to work on their oral skills. The paper or PowerPoint portion of the project is a great way for those future journalists or authors to highlight writing skills. Students also provide their classmates with feedback during the process by peer editing rough drafts or note cards. As you can see, several important skills are employed during the process of Project Showcase, but most of all we participate in Project Showcase to instill a love of learning and to *inspire students with the passion to excel*! # Halloween can be a fun time for children, but please make sure they are following safety precautions:

-Encourage children to have fun collecting treats, but tell them to wait until they return home to eat any.

-Inspect all treats and throw away any torn or unsealed wrappers.

-If your child has allergies, check the ingredient list. (You may need to consult product's website)

-Children should understand that they should trick or treat only at homes of neighbors that they know.

-Younger children should always be accompanied by an adult.

-Check masks to make sure children can see and breathe easily.

-Purchase face paints, glues and glitters made of nontoxic materials. Be aware that some children can have allergic reactions to these products.

-Use caution with any electric lights, or jack-o-lanterns due to fire risks.

# Field Tríp Feature: Fourth Grade Goes to Lake Lanier

On September 27<sup>th</sup>, the fourth grade team took their students to Lake Lanier for an interactive and hands-on experience tied to a unit on weather. The Lake Lanier Aquatic Learning Center is considered a floating classroom, where students put on life jackets and hop on a boat. The tour guides are affiliated with the Elachee Nature Science Center, and many of them have experience in different fields of science.

Throughout the tour, the students were given many opportunities to connect what they were learning in school. The students discussed watershed, turbidity of water, and the pH levels of water. Students studied different organisms located in Lake Lanier with the use of microscopes, they lowered water probes to determine

the clarity, and they took the water's temperature. They even watched water turn from cloudy to clear with the use of chemicals! The students connected these learning experiences to the healthiness of the water and related it to ecosystems, which was a previous unit learned in August and September.

We look forward to another hands-on experience given to the fourth graders on Friday, October 18, 2013. The scientists at Lake Lanier are coming to us, and they plan on making our students scientists of water by giving them hands on experiments to manipulate water. These manipulation techniques include various uses of chemicals including acid!

Keeping up with technology is something we try to do at McGinnis Woods, and this year is no exception. The new Windows Surface RT Tablets, purchased by the Parent Association with Boosterthon funds are being used by 2nd and 3rd graders this year. The Surface RT offers the best of both worlds – is it a tablet or is it a laptop? It's BOTH! The 3rd graders have loved them and are already using these amazing resources on a daily basis. 3rd grade took off to

Space using the tablets. They were able to research on the internet, then used a planets app and finally created a PowerPoint to present to the class, all on one devise! Students are able to save their work on the tablet and then present the documents using the Promethean board. Student have also been fighting ninjas and racing cars as they practice their math facts on the tablets. They have read non-fiction and fiction stories and summarized them using the story app. Students are able to practice for Worldy Wise tests, read for enjoyment, type in Word and make videos, too. The students are free to come up with their own ideas of how to use the tablet and then share their successes with the class. As you can see, the ideas are endless and the possibilities limitless, and we are grateful to have this powerful tool to use each day to enrich our learning.
