## Parents Night Out Planned for September 16th





## What's The Name Of That Creek?

Many exciting things are going on with the Outdoor Classroom and the Nature Trail at our beloved McGinnis Woods! First of all, our school is in the process of being certified through Explore Nature. They are a National Organization that specializes in premier, well-rounded, outdoor education. Perhaps even more exciting, is the fact that our school has partnered up with "Keep Forsyth Beautiful". K.F.C.B. is a fantastic organization that is in charge of recording scientific data here in Forsyth County. Kevin Smith, who does a terrific job with the company's community outreach programs, is allowing us to pilot a few educational programs which are designed to have community volunteers and students take part in real data being used by scientists. For example, our second and third grade classes will be tracking and recording frogs and amphibians in the surrounding habitat: namely the creek and forest that is on our school's campus. The students' data results will be uploaded to the ACTUAL Forsyth County website (more info @ http://www.georgiaadoptastream.com/db/amphibians.html) where it will be used by biologists to track amphibian population migration. How cool is that?!? That is so much better than doing a worksheet or watching a video about frog populations! Our students will be creating real scientific data!

But the frog program is far from the only program we have adopted through K.F.C.B. Each grade level will be participating in a program that includes tracking and monitoring scientific data. Our fourth and fifth graders will be performing a habitat survey of our nature trail and doing chemical testing of the creek. The sixth through the eighth graders will be monitoring habitats in our outdoor classroom and running a littering and recycling program to help both the school itself and the surrounding area.

I must admit, I am saving the most exciting bit for last: Our Name The Creek Contest! Amazingly enough, the creek that runs through the school campus does not have an official name. Kevin Smith has presented us with the opportunity to come up with a name that will be adopted by Forsyth County, mapmakers and the scientific community at large. What an opportunity! We have completed phase one of the voting. Students turned in names that they created and a group of teachers reviewed them and selected the top five entries. They are: Inspiration Creek, McGinnis Creek, Wildcat Creek, Woodsy Creek and The Wildcat Waterway. Next week, our students will cast a vote on a ballot to have their say about the creek's name, so, stay tuned! Things are happening out there in the woods!





## Student Council and Beta Club Updates


## 5th Graders Learning to Keyboard During Electives
