




TreeTop Quest

Our 5th-8th Grade enjoyed a great trip to Gwinnet Environmental and Heritage Center's TreeTop Quest. TreeTop Quest incorporates ropes courses and zip lines for both adventure and teamwork for groups. Students were given instructions on how to use all equipment before entering the practice course. Once students graduated to the real courses, the fun really began! Many of our more daring students quickly moved through the easier courses on to



those that were more challenging; others enjoyed the slightly easier courses. The main reason for choosing this trip was to give all of our middle grades students a chance to work as a team and develop teambuilding skills. Throughout the trip students not only helped one another, but encouraged one another. Students helped each other with use of the equipment and tips on how to handle different obstacles. Students also encouraged others students to try harder courses or just try obstacles that were personal challenges. The middle grades team teachers were proud of how well the students worked together and hope they will continue to use this skills in class, on teams and in life.





Welcome to the new school year at McGinnis Woods Country Day School Preschool. Our preschool is open year round, but in August the majority of our students transition to new classrooms. In the preschool we base our curriculum on the *Creative Curriculum* model. We emphasize learning our ABC's, numbers, colors, and shapes, but we also are learning so much more about the world around us.

Some of the themes we have learned about so far have been:

Back to School: where the children learned about classroom duties and school procedures and rules. The children also had fun welcoming and making new friends.

Transportation: the children studied different forms of transportation which included, cars, buses, taxi cars, airplanes, helicopters, hot air balloons, boats, submarines, jet skis, and bicy-

cles! Each child had a favorite mode of transportation and we built new vocabulary each day too!

Nursery Rhymes: the children learned about rhyming words, memorization of rhymes, and repetition of words and sounds.

Labor Day and Work: the children discovered interesting facts about different occupations and also learned about being safe while at work.

McGinnis Woods also offers exciting special activities for the preschool and pre-k children weekly during the school day! These programs provide the children with excellent opportunities to develop skills, keep active and learn sports for life. Some of the unique programs you may choose to take advantage of are:

Ankle Biters Tennis is for ages 2 and up with Coach Shaun. Children learn how to hold a racket, strike a ball and the basics of tennis.

Ballet or Ballet and Tap is for ages 2 and up with Ms. Kim of Creative Movement.

Happy Feet Soccer is for children 18 months and older. Children learn basic ball handling skills and how to play the game of soccer.

Playball is for ages 2 and up. Children learn a variety of skills needed for sports activities which focus on fitness and health with Coach Justin.

Tumble Time Bus is for ages 2 and up. This is a miniature gymnastics program taught by Mr. Paul and Ms. Lydia and takes place inside of a converted bus.

We have made an addition to our staff, Ms. Christine has joined us in the 3TB classroom. Christine has her CDA and many years of experience in preschool classrooms. Stop in and give her a warm McGinnis Woods welcome when you have the chance.


