

# 2015 First Lego League Robotics Club: Trash Trek Challenge

The Wildcats Robotics Team had their first competition of the year on December 5, 2015. We received many compliments from other teams and the volunteers at the event, and the children did a fabulous job on all three presentations (robot design, Trash Trek project, and teamwork).

The Trash Trek robot game was challenging because we competed against some older, seasoned teams. Out of the five game rounds, our highest score was 113 points putting us into 21st place out of 26 teams. The mission which placed us in the 21st place was problematic due to the fact that our robot was missing a wheel and had points taken off. Ms. Lindsey was very proud of the children's ability to problem solve in such stressful environments and in just two and a half minutes in which teachers are not allowed to help in any way.

Overall, it was an exciting and intense day, but we still tried our best and did a fantastic job! During the day, the team completed many team building exercises that brought our children together as a team, and they were all smiling and happy even though it was quite stressful. Now, we are preparing for the Sumobot Challenge competition which takes place next semester.







#### STEM and Art in Prek-5



When the word STEM is spoken in a classroom the excitement in the classroom is evident. The children love the unique hands on projects. They love to experiment with materials to make something out of nothing. It gives the children self-confidence to tackle a project and succeed without any help from an adult.

PreK-5 had an exciting STEM and Art day exploring simple machines. S(Science)- the children learned about different simple machines by going on a scavenger hunt around the school. T

(Technology)- the children played a simple machines look and find game on Game Pop Jr. E(Engineering)- the children engineered a pulley, vehicles using Kinex (wheel, axel, screw), and an inclined plane. They explored with levers (scissors) to cut paper and wedges (plastic knives) to cut playdough. M(Math)- the children graphed his/her favorite simple machine. Art- the children used an inclined plane to create marble art paintings. They turned out AMAZING!!!!




## 3rd Session of Discovery Clubs Start in January

All funds raised from the book fair assist with purchasing books and other materials for our library and classrooms. Due to your overwhelming support books were sent to every classroom in


our school.
