

ent countries and peoples along with their different cultures. The war of course was no fun with many young men being injured or killed. (Women were not allowed in a battle zone back then). Being in the service caused us young kids to mature fast and become young adults.

Today, there are still a lot of young men and women in harms way over in the Middle East who could use everyone's prayers as they fight for freedom.

Thank you again for the letters. I was very impressed with the content written by each student. Please pass along my feelings and heartfelt thanks to the children.

Several students will be able to participate in the trial as Pig's Attorney, Big Bad Wolf, the Plaintiff, Sylvester Cat, the Plaintiff's Witness, and as Miss Piggy, Defense Witness, just to name a few. The rest of the students will be jurors, and determine the outcome of the trial. We can't wait to experience this amazing learning opportunity!
