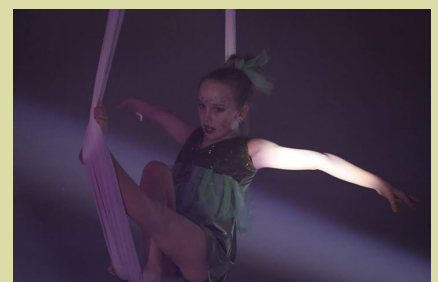

They learned that a butterfly lays an egg on a leaf, a caterpillar comes out of an egg, the caterpillar makes a chrysalis, and out of the chrysalis comes a butterfly. It was amazing for the students to see first hand how much a caterpillar grows! They were so tiny when they arrived and the caterpillars grew ten times their original size by the time they were ready to spin a chrysalis.

The children were eager to see the metamorphosis from caterpillar to butterfly. They patiently waited for an entire week! When we returned to school after a long weekend of suspense, the butterflies had emerged from the chrysalis! The children were ecstatic. After observing the butterflies for a time, we decided that we would release them at recess the next day. All of the Pre-K sat in a circle to observe the butterflies one last time before saying goodbye to our newly emerged friends. Ms. Lisa unzipped the butterfly's temporary habitat and the butterflies slowly came out one by one and happily flew away to explore their new world!

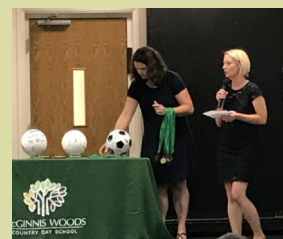
Wildcat Chat

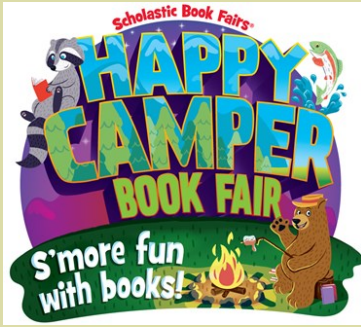

This year the PreK-4th grade Field Day was designed around a Luau theme. The students traveled from station to station playing activities such as water relays, hula hoops, coconut hockey and tug of war. The 4th graders had their own Harry Potter themed activities including quidditch, volleyball and capture the golden snitch.

The 5-8th graders beat the rain with their Field Day which was held at Fowler Park on Monday, May 22. They played many of the same games that the 4th graders had played earlier in the month. Additionally, they held a water balloon toss, played both dodgeball and kickball to keep them busy.



Overnights Help Learning Come Alive!

Each year the students at McGinnis Woods look forward to specific overnight trips to cap off their school year. This year was no exception and the students and their families or chaperones learned many new things and had wonderful tales to tell and memories to share after their trips.

The first graders spent the night at Zoo Atlanta and toured the exhibits at dusk, met some of the smaller animals in a hands on visit, and learned all about the kitchens where the food for the animals is prepared.



The 2nd graders had a great time at DeSoto Caverns, learned all about the significance of the caverns along with new vocabulary like stalactites and stalagmites and then slept in the cave!



The 3rd grade headed to Chattanooga, Tennessee to visit the zoo and Aquarium to Sleep in the Deep. They started their day at the Chattanooga Zoo visiting a variety of animals, riding camels, circumventing the zoo via train and cooling down on the indoor carousel. They then watched the IMAX, Engineering Our World, which was so inspiring that all of the students and adults wished they could be engineers, too! The students and their parents got up close and personal with sting rays, baby tiger sharks and explored the new lemur exhibit. The group had the whole aquarium to themselves along with their guides. Now that is learning at its best!



The 4th graders spent a few days at Nature's Classroom in Mentone Alabama and learned all about how to survive in the wilderness, how to build a bridge out of rope, and how to navigate through some cool rock formations. They enjoyed their time in the out of doors and hope to visit again in the future.



The 5-7th graders enjoyed their time at Patriots Point in Charleston, South Carolina and explored and slept on the USS Yorktown. They enjoyed learning about the inner workings of an aircraft carrier and the surrounding environment at Patriots Point. Sumo Bots



During the spring semester, the WildBots worked on building and programming SumoBots. There are many ways to design and program a sumobot and our students did an amazing job creating theirs. Usually a robot of this type starts with a light sensor as a key element and then the sky is the limit.

In a robot Sumo match, two robots start inside a ring marked with a border of a contrasting color and try to be the first one to push the other robot outside the ring. The robots are disqualified if they accidentally drive outside the ring themselves. This creative competition is similar in fashion and modeled after actual Sumo wrestling.



The SumoBots competition was a great success and the students are excited about an opportunity to build new robots next year!

Annual Talent Show Was Fantastic!

The annual talent show was held on May 16th for the entire student body, parents and friends.
