The students in Ms. Kristen's class have been busy working hard using our new reading program called MaxScholar. MaxScholar is an interactive comprehensive, multi sensory, and language-based reading program. The entire program uses an Orton-Gillingham approach to learning which is why it is so effective.

MaxScholar has three main components: MaxPhonics, MaxReading, and MaxWords. In MaxPhonics the students learn consonants, vowels, blends, and digraphs using various visual, auditory and tactile drills. In MaxReading the students highlight, summarize and out-

scr

line the text they read. In MaxWords the students learn syllabication, spelling rules, prefixes, suffixes and roots.

Max Scholar Program Enhances Our Enrichment Program

The best part about MaxScholar is that the students can access the program at home or on a portable device. In class most of the students use Ms. Kristen's classroom ipads for their work. The students have been setting weekly goals for themselves and will set monthly goals in 2018.

Ms. Kristen enjoys using MaxScholar with her students and has found it to be a great addition to her other lessons. The students love Max Scholar and are always asking to use it when they come to her class.

Winter Weather Wear Tips from Nurse Angie

The winter season is approaching (and has already made a debut this December). Georgia temperatures fluctuate, so please be mindful of the temperatures predicted for the day. Have your children dressed appropriate to the weather forecast. Keep in mind this COLD acronym when choosing winter wear for your children:

C-Clean clothing: clean clothes retain insulation.

O-overheating: avoid wearing too many layers and becoming overheated. Remove layers as necessary. Sweating causes moisture that leads to cooling of your body.


L-Layer clothing: wear clothing loose and layered. Loose layers provide more insulation than one thick layer. These layers trap air and keep in heat. Layered clothes can be removed if overheating occurs.

D-(stay) dry: remove wet clothing immediately. Avoid sweating and producing moisture build up.

Practice this acronym and stay warm, dry, and safe this winter season!
