photos proudly displayed in the classrooms. The children learned what they need to do to keep themselves healthy by eating well, exercising and getting plenty of


rest! They used their 5 senses to explore new tastes, sounds and smells. It was great to see their reactions to the sweet and then the sour!

The Accelerated Reader Program at McGinnis Woods

At McGinnis Woods, we believe reading is one of the most important and fundamental skills students need to succeed. Reading is considered as one of the best practices to stimulate intellectual development for students (Reading by Phonics, 2018). McGinnis Woods students are encouraged to read and are given access to books they want to read and the ability to select books on their own. To inspire our students to achieve reading success, our school uses the Accelerated Reader (AR) program.

Accelerated Reader or AR for short is a curriculum-based assessment tool, which delivers a summary and analysis of results to allow teachers to monitor reading practice skills of students.

The process begins with a student selecting and reading a book and after reading, taking a quick computerized test. Books are assigned a point value and students are awarded points based on their results. The point value is determined by the number of words, the reading difficulty, the number of syllables in words and sentence complexity.

Students in 2nd-8th grades are required to read 25 books each school year. Students will select books that fall within their Accelerated Reader (AR) range to read. Any type of book may be read including Graphic Novels, Picture Books, E-books, Chapter Books, and Non-Fiction Books. Students may check the AR level of their book by visiting the site www.arbookfind.com. This site details the reading and interest level as well as a brief synopsis of the book.

Students in Pre-K-1st grades are encouraged to read for at least twenty minutes each night. Introducing reading at the early stages is a perfect foundation to build upon as students reading interests and levels grow.

If you are looking for a great series to start or a book to read at night with your child, please visit Ms. Jacki in our school library. A Trip to INK



The kindergarten Cats had their first field trip adventure of the school year on August 23rd. They travelled to Gainesville to visit INK, the Interactive Neighborhood for Kids. Ink is a unique, one of a kind destination where children can role play and learn through practical experiences. INK is an annual destination for McGinnis Woods students because research shows that play is important to healthy brain development and allows children to develop their imaginations, dexterity and cognitive skills while developing emotional grit.

While at INK, students enjoyed exploring the many rooms set up to replicate an airline, a playhouse, a medical clinic, a radiology

clinic, a salon and much, much more. They had fun pretending to be doctors, actors, dentists, police officers, farmers, and many more!

This trip was so popular with the students and aligns well with our current unit about Community Helpers. When asked which job was their favorite, several students replied "being a police officer" and "being an actor." A great time was had by all!



Did You Know?

McGinnis Woods offers many opportunities for our students to develop leadership skills. Students in the middle school especially benefit from these nationally recognized clubs which include:



Jr. Beta Club is a national organization that focuses on leadership and service. It is open to our fifth though eighth graders who achieve all A's or all A's and one B. These students volunteer to help our community here at school though beautification projects and peer tutoring with our younger students. In addition, they work with outside nonprofit organizations to help those in our community at large. In the past, students have visited with residents at assisted living facilities, collected food for local foodbanks, worked at animal shelters, and provided funding for a 12 X 12 foot house to be built in Guatemala.



Student Council is an in school opportunity open to students in grades Kindergarten through Eighth grade. Student Council officers will be elected in September from a pool of students in grades five through eight that choose to run for office. Additionally, each class will choose two punctual, responsible students to serve as their class representatives. These students are chosen in many ways including voting, essay writing, or teacher discretion. The officers will plan events like Red Ribbon Week, Order in Days, and the Staff vs. Student kickball game. Representatives will assist officers with tasks and attend monthly meetings.



Safety Patrol is open to students in grades four through eight. Students need to fill out the application for consideration. Once students are chosen to be a patrol, they must consistently complete their assignments and maintain exemplary behavior to participate. Some of the patrol assignments students are given include walking PK students to their class, raising and lowering SAFETY PATROL the flag, and opening car doors during carpool. type items. Be on the lookout for more information about the election and class representatives coming soon.




Patrols Help In Many Ways
