Science Olympiad Team Combines Science with Fun




The Elementary Science Olympiad team at McGinnis Woods is busy preparing for the regional competition to be held on Saturday, March 30, 2019. Our team consists of twenty-one students, from 3rd grade through 5th grade. This year we are competing in 18 events – with topics ranging from Oceanography, Weather, Forensic Science, and Geology to unique building events and math challenges.

Weekly the team comes together with the parent volunteers and Ms. Anne, the club sponsor, to research and perfect their activities and approaches to solve the many activities required for the upcoming competition. McGinnis Woods will be competing at a regional tournament with the hopes of advancing to the state tournament which will be held at Kennesaw State University, on May 11, 2019. In recent years McGinnis Woods teams have done well in many of the individual events, but we have never finished 1st overall,

so this year's team has set its sights high and is diligently preparing for the best outcome. Go Wildcats!







Science Fair Projects in the Lower Grades



The Science Fair Project is an annual event here at McGinnis Woods. The project ties into our curriculum and mission by providing a hands on learning opportunity for our students to explore the Scientific Method in an authentic way. Pre-K, Kindergarten and First Grade students complete class projects at school. Each unique project is based on an in class experiment and reinforces the scientific method. Once completed the class creates a Tri-fold board to share their findings with the other students at the school. This year Prek class experiments included Sink or Float experi-

ments using a variety of variables.

Students in second, third and fourth grades pick a question that they have about a topic and then research or create an experiment to help them find an answer to that question. The scientific method guides the students as they work on their projects at home. This process includes devising a hypothesis, creating and following procedures and working with variables.


Final projects and presentations are due on March 11th. Each student will present their science project findings to their class and then the judging begins. Four students from second, third and fourth grades will be entered into the school-wide Science Fair. Judges from the school will assess these top choices. The winners of the Science Fair projects will be announced during STEM Family Fun Night on March 21. Be sure to join us that evening to see all of the amazing science fair projects, engage with the budding scientists at our school and to enjoy the different STEM activities taking place throughout the school!

Míddle School Science Fair Projects are Underway

McGinnis Woods students are excited to prepare for the annual Science Fair! This school-wide learning experience encourages students to use skills in critical thinking, research, and problem solving – all while practicing the scientific method using multiple variables. This year, 5th through 8th grade students will choose to present their Science Fair Projects on either a tri-fold display board or a PowerPoint presentation.

Final projects are due on Monday, March 11th. Top winners from each middle school grade level will be chosen to represent their class in the annual Science Fair contest. The winning projects will be evaluated by several judges, and a 1st and 2nd place will be awarded from each middle school grade level.

The projects will be displayed for viewing and Science Fair winners will be announced at the STEM Family Fun Night on March 21st. Be sure to join us for this fun family event!
