We are very proud of our excellent team of teachers and administrators who are devoted to caring for our young preschoolers each day!

Spring is here and we have BIG plans in the Preschool. We kicked off Spring with our annual Preschool Spring Egg Hunt and Book Fair social. April will bring Earth Day and the planting of our new garden boxes. Our threes and fours

cannot wait to get their hands dirty planting flowers, fruits, and veggies for us all to enjoy! Each class will also get the opportunity to decorate a bird house that will then be hung on our nature trail. Our little ones continue to learn so much through our Frog Street Curriculum hands-on activities.

Our Infant and Junior Toddler classes have been extra busy with our little ones. The babies have been working hard on sitting up, crawling, walking, and eating table foods. Their favorite activities include singing, dancing, painting, and reading books. We love watching them learn and grow each day!


The Preschool is also hosting Parents Night Out. They will enjoy dinner, fun and games, and end their night with a movie, too. The children may wear their




### Scholastíc Book Faír
